CONDITIONS

Equipment:

- Tables: Up To 12 Tibhar Tables Available For Play.
- Nets: Up To 12 Tibhar Nets Fitted To Tables.
- Ball: Tibhar 3 Star Balls (White).

ELIGIBILITY:

- Only registered members of TTNZ and players affiliated to ITTF member countries are eligible. TTNZ members must quote their membership number on their entry form.
- Age category eligibility is determined by competitor's age as at 31.12.2010 for junior events and as at 31.12.2011 for veteran events. Proof of age may be required.
- B Grade is open to players not rated in the top 25 on the latest TTNZ rating list.
- The organising committee reserves the right to refuse entry to unrated (or other) players regarded as too strong for the graded events.

ENTRIES:

- Envelopes containing entries must be postmarked no later than the closing date and arrive at WTTA no later than one day after the scheduled closing date.
- The correct fees must accompany entries. WTTA reserves the right to impose a penalty for late payments. Fees are refundable if advice of a withdrawal is received by WTTA at least one day prior to the tournament date.
- No player may enter more than 8 events. WTTA reserves the right to refuse any entry and to vary restrictions at its discretion.
- Both players in any doubles pairing must submit separate individual entries for the same doubles event.
- Any entrant wishing to receive acknowledgement of receipt of their entry form must enclose a stamped addressed envelope, or provide a return email address. Otherwise entries will be processed without acknowledgement.
- Players may not wear white shirts during tournament play.

Draws:

- Round Robin group qualifying shall be used for singles events followed by knock out. Two players shall qualify for the knock out draw. The losers will automatically be placed in a consolation event, the consolation events will be Open Men, Over 40 & B Grade combined, Open Women, Over 40 & B Grade combined, Under 21,18,15 Boys combined, Under 21,18,15 Girls combined, NB: No player will be entered into more than two consolation events.
- For doubles events seeded knockout draws shall be used.
- Notwithstanding the above, where an event has less than 4 entries, the round robin format may then be used.
- Any event with less than 4 entries or three doubles pairs may be cancelled at the discretion of WTTA. Players so affected may be entered into alternative events if possible.
- WTTA reserves the right to make alterations to any draw.

Matches:

- All Open matches shall be the best of seven advantage games to 11 after group play, all other matches shall be best of five advantage games to 11.

Drugs:

- The New Zealand Sports Drug Agency reserves the right to conduct random drug testing

Gluing:

- No gluing shall be permitted inside the stadium other than within areas designated for the purpose.

Authority:

- The Tournament Manager and/or Controller reserve the right to vary these conditions, and to exercise control over all activities within the stadium and adjacent areas. This includes the right to default players who fail to respond when called to the table within the published or announced playing session times.
- The Referee and delegated assistants reserve the right to apply and enforce the Laws and International Regulations of table tennis as adopted by the ITTF and TTNZ. Their interpretation of these Laws and Regulations is final.
